



Adult Programming Aggregate Results for Routt County –2010-2011

Grand Futures Prevention Coalition collected 41 post-surveys, administered at various parent and community presentations, throughout the 2010-2011 fiscal year. Presentations were held in Steamboat Springs and were advertised to all members of Routt County. Local experts were on sight to either give the presentation, or to answer questions from the audience.

Presentation titles were:

Juvenile Justice Symposium

Raising Teens in Routt County Today - Parent Empowerment Forum

How to Define & Share Your Wisdom about Sex - A Workshop for Parents of Teenagers

Demographic Information: Not all individuals chose to provide their demographic information, however, the information provided indicated that the respondents were made up of 13.0% (n=4) male and 87.0% (n=26) female. When asked the education level of their child, the majority indicated middle school students, representing 42% of responses. However, elementary school students represented 20%, high school students - 27%, college students - 5%, and other levels of education – 5%.

Presentation Feedback: When indicating their level of agreement with the statements below, respondents were given the options of; strongly agree, agree, neither agree nor disagree, disagree, and strongly disagree. Only 2% (n=1) of respondents disagreed to finding the print resources helpful. No other respondents indicated disagree or strongly disagree to any other questions. Points of interest as well as full results are shown below.

- 95% of respondents either strongly agreed or agreed that the format of the presentation(s) was understandable and easy to follow.
- 83% of respondents either strongly agreed or agreed that the print resources were helpful.
- 91% of respondents either strongly agreed or agreed that the information provided by the experts was helpful.
- 92% of respondents either strongly agreed or agreed to plan on sharing what they learned with friends and family.
- Only 27% of respondents strongly agreed that the event provided the information that they expected.
- Only 24% of respondents strongly agreed that they have a better understanding of the presentation’s topic.
- **Overall, 39% of participants strongly agreed to questions asked; 48% agreed; 13% neither disagreed nor agreed.**

Presentation Awareness: The post-survey asked parents and community members to indicate how they heard about the presentation or event. Results show that the majority of respondents heard through the Local Newspaper (35%) and through a School Email (28%). Respondents also heard about the presentation through Word of Mouth (15%), Online (13%), and Direct Mailings (9%).

Other Topics of Interest: The post-survey also asked parents and community members which other topics they would like to see offered by Grand Futures and its partners. Results indicated that the majority of respondents were interested in Parent Support (33%) and Youth Development (26%). Respondents were also interested in Substance Abuse (23%) and Mental Health (16%). Other open-ended topics of interest are shown below.

- How kids can get involved in the community and give back
- Sexting, adult/child inappropriate kissing
- School Involvement, since it is part of the solution
- Bullying/Harassment
- Cyber Bullying
- Stats of issues in RC
- Sexuality, STD's prevention
